

NATIONAL MENTORING MONTH + YOUTH VOICE DAY (01/23)

Many research studies demonstrate the powerful impact a mentor can play in the life of another individual whether an adult, teen, or child. Today, **66% of surveyed teens** report that despite having a mentor they still experience times when they needed mentor support. (*Mentoring.org*) **How can supportive adults offering natural mentorship or program-guided mentorship ensure they are recognizing a mentee's unmet need?** According to Mentoring.org these 5 key characteristics make meaningful mentors: accepting of the youth for who they are, listening carefully, trusting the youth, being patient with the youth, and taking the youth seriously.

Using these traits to form a meaningful relationship with a child or teen can result in growing their sense of belonging, support improved mental health, improve their academic work, and increase their likelihood of graduating high school. As a resource caregiver, you have already accepted a supportive role as natural mentor to the children and youth in your home. The positive impacts you have on them will be lasting!

FOSTER PARENT COLLEGE SPOTLIGHT: TRAUMA-INFORMED PARENTING

A new year means a renewed focus on resource caregiver training. We've heard from many caregivers and families about an interest in building skills to better prepare themselves and their homes for foster children and youth. Each month, we will spotlight one Foster Parent College course, providing insights into skills and practices to support parenting children and youth with behavioral health needs and trauma histories, and we will continue to host virtual learning sessions to discuss course concepts and practices from your lived experiences.

Our January Course Spotlight is Trauma-Informed Parenting. For parents and caregivers of children who experienced traumatic events, this course explores how past experiences impact children's behavior, describes the aftereffects of trauma, and provides strategies for adapting parenting styles to the needs of children. Techniques learned in the course will guide approaches to other coursework, discussions and using strategies in common scenarios when supporting foster children.
